## Coon Lake Improvement District (CLID) 11th Annual Meeting July 25, 2018

MINUTES Call to Order

Chair Al Beck called the meeting to order 7:05 PM. 25 total attendees recorded by Ron Croteau. 2 Guests and 23 property owners signed for election Ballots.

Slide 3. CLID Directors Introduced

CLID board, Al Beck, Arlan Mercil, Ken Johnson and Mike Bury. Bob Czeck was not able to attend but agreed to be a nominee for the open 3 year term directors' position. Al Beck requested three times from the floor for any further nominees and upon hearing no response asked for a motion to approve a white ballot to elect Bob Czeck to the three year term, which was moved and seconded with no discussion and passed unanimously.

Slide 4. Areas to Get Involved CLID CLIA Spotter Teams-Discussion regarding CLP delineation method used in 2017-2018. CLID Communications CLID Finance/ Fund Raising CLID board member CLIA board and committee member

Slide 5. Lake Plan Update Goal: Reduce invasive species infestation to less than 5%. Al explained the current state of Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) and how it has hybridized with the native and become resistant to successful treatment using 2, 4-D as we had been doing, and the options open for future treatments with approval and cooperation from the MN DNR and the herbicide applicator.

Slide 6, 7 and 8. Treatment summary reviewed. Summary from 2009 -2018 reviewed from Power Point. Most all of our delineated and requested acres are being approved for treatment.

Slide 9, 10 and 11- Progress. CLP and EWM graphs.

Slide 12, 13, and 14 CLP and EWM inspection and treatment maps discussed. AIS Consulting Services was again contacted this year for a fee of \$525.00 for locating CLP using sonar approach. Increase in EWM discussed. CLP treatment was completed in May. EWM treatment was competed in late July. Water clarity on the lake is better. Al submitted a request to Anoka County for a reimbursement grant of up to \$2732 for treatments in 2018.

Slide 15 and 16.

Water clarity/quality graphs discussed – maintaining water quality below impaired status with clarity fluctuating minimally. East Bay WQ improving and West Bay consistent. (Important Note: Not discussed in meeting - Most lakes are considered impaired with excesses of 40 ppb or mg per liter of Total Phosphorous, 14 ppb of Chloropyll a and a Secchi transparency of 1.4 meters or about 4 1/2 ft.)

Slide 17 and 18. Proposed Lake Plan 2019 Continue early spring CLP treatment as necessary. Continue EWM treatment in East Basin. Treat the entire West Basin with an herbicide early in the season provided an updated, approved Lake Vegetation Management Plan (LVMP) results from cooperation with the MN DNR. Conduct annual vegetation survey if deemed necessary. Grants not a guarantee due to decrease in funding.

Slide 21. Motions Motion for Projects over \$5,000.00 \$117,500 for treatment of Eurasian Milfoil and Curly leaf Pondweed in 2019 for AIS treatments. Motioned and Seconded with minimal discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion for Special Tax Assessment Increase the assessment of \$25 to \$100. Motioned and Seconded with minimal discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion for the 2017 Proposed Expenses 2019 expenses of \$130,400 including administration expenses. Motioned and Seconded. Motion passed unanimously Elections
